# Dress Code

The Henley High School Dress Code describes the approved uniform that students must wear when traveling to and from school, in class, and on any excursions.

### **Uniform supplier**

# School uniform

There are different versions of the school uniform that are to be worn at different times as required. The versions include the standard, PE, Sports Academy and alternative uniforms.

# **Standard uniform**

The standard uniform is to be worn by students at all times when on school grounds, travelling to and from school and at all school organised activities and events, except where the PE, Sports Academy or alternative uniforms are required.

The uniform items are non-gendered. The summer dress and skirt must be worn 10cm above the kneecap or longer.





### **PE uniform**

The PE uniform is to be worn during PE lessons. Sports Academy uniforms are not to be worn during PE lessons. Students can arrive at school in their PE uniform if their first lesson is PE. Students can leave school in their PE uniform if their last lesson is PE.

The uniform items are non-gendered. Sporting footwear should be worn for all PE and sporting activities.

### **Sports Academy uniforms**

Sport-specific uniforms are available for each Sports Academy program (see the Devon Clothing website for details).

Students must wear their specific Sports Academy uniform during Sports Academy lessons. The PE uniform is not to be worn during Sports Academy lessons.

Students can arrive at school in their Sports Academy uniform if their first lesson is Sports Academy. Students can leave school in their Sports Academy uniform if their last lesson is Sports Academy.

The uniform items are non-gendered.

Sporting footwear should be worn for all PE and sporting activities.

### **Alternative uniforms**

Alternative uniforms include clothing items required for special events and activities. Where students are required to wear an alternative uniform, communications will be sent to parents, caregivers and students. Alternative uniforms include:

- Specific clothing required for dance and drama performances
- School blazers
  - ✓ School blazers are required for specific events
  - School blazers are not a required item of uniform to be purchased; the school borrowing policy applies to those wearing a blazer
- Year 12 jacket
  - / Year 12 students are permitted to purchase and wear the Year 12 jacket
- House colours
  - Students are encouraged to support their House by wearing house colours in a respectful manner during particular events such as Sports Day

# **Uniform accessories**

#### Footwear

The footwear requirements for all students are:

- ✔ Plain black, flat-soled, leather, lace up school shoes
- Plain black, flat-soled, leather, lace up sports shoes
- Plain black, flat-soled, leather t-bar shoes.

The following shoes are not acceptable:

- Boots covering the ankle
- ✓ Slip on black shoes with exposed toes
- Shoes made from canvas or fabric.

#### Socks and stockings

Skin-coloured stockings are permitted to be worn with the summer dress. Black stockings are permitted to be worn with the winter skirt.

White, grey or black socks with no logos can be worn by students.

#### **Undergarments**

Undergarments can be worn provided they cannot be seen (e.g. sleeves or collars should not be visible).

#### Spray and Puffer Jacket

The spray and puffer jacket can be worn in general classes but removed in locations where there are safety concerns.

#### Hair, jewellery and makeup

Minimal makeup and unobtrusive nail polish may be worn. Students in uniform are expected to be clean shaven. Hair dyed an unnatural colour is discouraged as we are preparing students for professional expectations. No visible tattoos are permitted.

#### Hats and beanies

The school cap is available to be worn by students for PE and outdoor activities. An alternative personal sun-smart hat may be worn for PE and outdoor activities as part of the sun smart strategy.

Students may wear either the school cap or a plain black bucket hat as part of their full school uniform. Within buildings, headwear is to be removed. Beanies are not to be worn indoors and are only for recess/lunch.

#### Protective clothing

Henley High School provides a safe learning environment. We adhere to safety guidelines specified by the Department for Education, SafeWork SA and the WHS Act.

Requirements regarding clothing, footwear and eye protection are explained to students attending practical courses.
