Uniform Policy

The Henley High School Uniform Policy has been developed in consultation with school community and approved by the Governing Council.

Students and families understand that enrolling at Henley High School means a requirement to wear the school uniform correctly and with pride. It demonstrates commitment to inclusion in our Henley High School community, and particularly to our school values.

Scope

All students shall wear the school uniform when on school grounds, travelling to and from school and at all school organised activities and events.

Out of scope

Alternative uniforms must be approved by Governing Council or Sub Committee.

Non-compliance will be dealt with through the school's Uniform Non-Compliance Procedure.

Detail

- ✓ Wearing the school uniform assists in the provision of a safe school environment and ensures students are easily identifiable.
- ✓ The school uniform provides cost effective durable clothing.
- ✓ All items, with the exception of shoes, must be purchased from the official uniform supplier for the school.
- ✓ The uniform contains a range of options to suit all sizes. The uniform supplier will work with families where the required size is not available.
- ✓ All uniform items are non-gendered.
- ✓ Consultation occurs when there is a proposed variation to the Uniform Policy or the Dress Code.
- ✓ Students must be in school uniform while on any excursion (unless otherwise advised by the teacher in charge).
- ✓ The standard uniform is to be worn at all times, except where the PE, Sports Academy or alternative uniforms are required.
- ✓ The PE and Sports Academy uniform are to be worn for PE and Sports Academy lessons, respectively.
- ✓ Students can arrive at school in their PE or Sports Academy uniform if their first lesson is PE or Sports Academy.
- ✓ Students can leave school in their PE or Sports Academy uniform if their last lesson is PE or Sports Academy.



- Alternative uniforms may only be worn when advised by the teacher in charge.
- If factors such as culture, religion, gender or finance impact on uniform compliance, families need to email the Principal for further discussion or to seek an exemption.

Roles and responsibilities

Students

Wear the uniform at all times as per the Uniform Policy and Dress Code.

Parents and caregivers

Provide their children with the school uniform and ensure it is maintained and in good condition.

Leaders and teachers

Monitor adherence to the Uniform Policy and address non-compliance through the Uniform Non-Compliance Procedure.

Leaders

Support teachers and parents in upholding the Uniform Policy.

Governing Council and Sub Committee

Periodically review and approve the Uniform Policy.

Definitions

School uniform

School uniform refers to the standard, PE, Sports Academy and alternative uniforms.

Standard uniform

The standard uniform is defined in the Dress Code.

PE uniform

The PE uniform is defined in the Dress Code.

Sports Academy uniform

The Sports Academy uniform is defined in the Dress Code.

Alternative uniforms

Alternative uniforms include clothing items required for special events and activities including dance, drama and the Year 12 jacket.

Uniform supplier

The official uniform supplier is defined in the Dress Code.
