- ✓ Learning About Myself activities through the MyCareerPortal website, including exploring life and career journeys, taking a Multiple Intelligences quiz, and identifying interests and skills.
- ✓ Engagement with Career Cards and 100 Jobs
- ✓ Encouragement of student agency through activities promoting self-reflection and decision-making, such as creating a Career Action Plan, participating in subject selection, and receiving course counselling.

By engaging in these activities, students develop strategies to build and maintain a positive self-concept, explore their interests and strengths, and make informed decisions about their future pathways.

Learning and work exploration

Exploration of careers across all subject curriculum areas to understand the diversity of opportunities available.

- ✓ Integration of career exploration into subject curriculum areas to expose students to various career options.
- ✓ Utilisation of resources like the MyCareerPortal website to discover and develop personal interests, skills, and potential career pathways.

Through these activities, students develop an understanding of the changing nature of work roles, explore lifelong learning opportunities, and gain valuable insights into the relationship between education and career goals.

Participation in the Business and Enterprise program and completion of Your Journey Presentations to enhance entrepreneurial skills and showcase career aspirations.

- ✓ Implementation of the Business and Enterprise program to foster entrepreneurial skills and understanding of work roles in society and the economy.
- ✓ Preparation of Your Journey Presentations to articulate personal and career goals.

By participating in these activities, students acquire skills to secure and maintain work opportunities, make informed career-enhancing decisions, and develop strategies to balance life and work roles effectively.
